## From Mary's Desk:

**Happiness:** Since 1998 a movement in psychology came upon the American scene. It is described as *positive psychology* and Dr. Tal Ben-Shahar, PhD teaches this subject at Harvard University. His is the most popular class on campus with over 1400 students attending each year. His book, Happier: Learn the Secrets to Daily Joy and Lasting Fulfillment, has been well received by a world filled with violence, strife, worry and financial strain. Positive psychology is a scientific study of what goes right in life. This newly christened approach to life examines what makes life most worth living, what is good and genuine about life even in the midst of suffering and difficulty. What is good about life is as real and authentic as what is bad in life. Not denying one, the research shows that emphasizing the positive: savoring creation, being grateful, moving one's heart toward forgiveness all add to the quality of life. Breathing with purpose at a red light, slowing down when one is angry or frustrated, taking quiet moments of reflective prayer brings meaning to our lives and protests the culture that wants to cloud life with bad news. Funny that some of the tenets of this modern look at happiness are akin to the very wisdom of the scriptures.

One of Ben-Shahar's suggestions is a type of very Ignatian spirituality. He suggests that at the end of the day, one has a notebook near one's bed. With mindful thoughtfulness, he suggests writing down five things to be grateful for in that day. In Ephesians, the writer warns never to fall asleep being angry: "Be angry, but do not sin; do not let the sun set on your anger." (Ephesians 4:26) which means that when we rest our heads upon our pillows and allow the quiet of sleep to heal our souls, it is best to go there with gratitude on our hearts and to let go of anger. The studies show that people with grateful hearts live longer, get sick less and recover more quickly when sick.

I find it most interesting that with each generation, the wisdom of the ages must be repeated in a new way, with a new spin, but at the core it is the same. Happiness is dependent on our interior attitudes of gratitude. Paul also says that "in all things give thanks to God." Funny what the scriptures reveal and how they are rediscovered in each new era. In the end, I suppose, it proves it works.

**Hostesses and Hospitality:** If you love to be around young adults in love and if you want to bring a smile to their faces, please consider hosting the Engaged Enrichment mornings for the young people preparing for marriage. There are just four sessions a year and you will be shown what to do because we have some great hostesses who will show you the ropes. The Engaged Enrichment day occurs on Saturday mornings in September, January, April and June. So only one commitment for the year...but an important one. ## Households In God's Service

In the ancient world, "household" was a wide-reaching concept. When Joshua today speaks of his household serving the Lord, he meant not just those people who lived inside his walls or those related to him by blood or marriage; he meant slaves or servants and their families and anyone indebted to him in any way. Even his livestock and other possessions would be consecrated to service of God. In our world, we value allowing individuals their freedom to choose how they live and wouldn't think of offering our pets to the service of God. But, as we discern our vocation as disciples baptized into Christ, we can come to realize how far-ranging the "households" of our lives still are: how we act toward our spouses, children, roommates or anyone we live with; our behavior with neighbors; or in public as we encounter many "strangers" every day in stores or traffic who suddenly are "next door" to us. How can we use our time, our resources, or gifts for selfless reasons rather than personal gain? No matter what life our witness to the Good News calls us to, we all have a "household" that must be consecrated to service of the Lord our God.

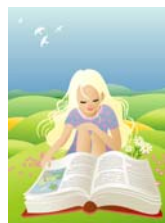
