From Mary's Desk:

I love to walk. So when my husband invited me to the 2nd Annual St. Vincent de Paul, *Walk for the Poor* along the lakefront across from St. Francis Seminary on rather an overcast but lovely Saturday, I looked forward to going. First, he said, there would be Mass under a white tent on the seminary grounds where all the Vincentians from the Milwaukee chapters would gather to celebrate their identity in Christ, who is the source of all love and goodness.

Then there were T-shirts for all of us and the proverbial excitement anticipating the walk. But the liturgy grabbed me as I sat with approximately 200 people, average age 65 and above and 15 teens from St. Romans. It was the Communion of Saints at its best, wrapped in the profound garments of age, gray heads and big hearts. Having lived with a Vincentian for several years, I realized the many hours, months and years Vincentians have reached out to the frightened people crushed by hard times; how many home visits, manned food pantries, clothing vouchers, volunteer hours were represented under that white tent. The vision of Frederic Ozanam, founder of the St. Vincent de Paul Society in 1833, at the height of the Industrial Revolution, came alive on this Autumn Saturday. There were some 20 people from the St. Mary' Chapter who walked, including a guy...our own Peter Valentine...who wore his Elvis impersonator costume (see the Catholic Herald, 9/24/09) for the walk. He walked hand in hand with his bride, witnessing to the solidarity with the poor. But it was Fr. Don Hying (Rector of the seminary) who spoke to the Vincentians during the liturgy that touched me most.

He spoke about a "*theology of response*". That is, a theology that sees each day of life as a time when God offers sundry opportunities to respond in love and kindness; to move from a self-focused perspective, to look out upon the other. It was our human need for salvation; our sin, our doubt, our suffering that caused God to *respond* to us. God's *response* to us was Jesus. Jesus' *response* to us is the invitation to believe in him, follow him, to be servant leaders. And our *response* to God is to serve Christ and we do that by enfleshing the love of God in order to give, in large ways or small.

Joyce Garbaciak was there to send us off on the walk and the Brewers comedic sausages came a runnin' to stop the traffic as we walked the three miles to raise money for the Needy Conference Fund, a fund specified for those parishes that serve the people in the central city where funds are minimal. The Vincentians are particularly grateful to the many people who pledged their support from St. Mary Parish to the Needy Conference Fund. You all deserve a T-shirt, for on the front of the shirt are the words: "Friend of the Poor".

Words of Wisdom

The spirit of wisdom, as we discover in today's first reading, comes to those who pray for her. Wisdom, like the word of God, carries a message of consolation as well as of great challenge. The Letter to the Hebrews tells us that the word of God, infused with the wisdom of God, is "sharper than any two-edged sword." We cannot shrink from the wisdom of God or from the word that has the power to penetrate our hearts and minds. Jesus, the living word of God, the embodiment of wisdom, has strong, deeply penetrating words for the rich young man who comes to him seeking answers to his most profound questions. Just when the young man thought he had done enough to fulfill God's commands, more was asked of him. This is no less true for US. © Copyright, J. S. Paluch Co.

With God All Things Are Possible

The story of the rich man is two stories, really; the dialogue between the earnest man and Jesus and the ensuing conversation between Jesus and the disciples. The rich man has kept all the rules and knows there is more. He seeks Jesus out for the greater challenge to go deeper in his walk with God. But his face falls when he learns the cost. Following Jesus is one thing; giving up his possessions is another.

The disciples at first see this test as too hard. If this is the standard, who can be saved? Peter perceives the parallel between the admonition to the rich man and the way of the disciples. "What you ask of him is what we ourselves have done!" They indeed left their nets, their homes, their way of life to become his followers. And Jesus promises Peter that one who has surrendered the old life in favor of the Gospel will be rewarded a hundredfold with property, family, persecution and eternal life.

Did somebody say persecution? If we read beyond this passage, we find the disciples amazed and afraid at this speech. No kidding! So Jesus once again explains what the Son of Man must suffer. Discipleship has its price and we are all like the rich man who finds it set just a bit higher than what we expected to pay. God's Word is Alive by Alice Camille, ACTA Publications 5559 W.
