#### Finance

St. Mary's is currently running an \$80,000 deficit for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023. The parish will not take an \$80,000 draw from the endowment fund this year. If needed, the parish will dip into the reserves to meet any deficits. The Finance Council is working on next year's budget. St. Mary's 60% share of the funds from The Love One Another campaign, which will be received over the next five years, can only be used for capital improvements, i.e. repairs to the church or school, not for day to day operations.
